NATIONAL NAVY SEAL MUSEUM GIVES BACK

Fort Pierce, FL, March 3, 2009 – In direct response to the ongoing financial turbulence, the National Navy SEAL Museum is offering free admission every second and third Saturday of each month.

With budgets getting tighter, discretionary spending on things like entertainment and travel is getting less and less. Because more families are looking for cost-effective ways to enjoy free time together, they are becoming re-acquainted with local attractions. The National Navy SEAL Museum, the only museum of its kind in the country, is one of these. “We recognize that, for many families, the costs involved in spending the day together border on being prohibitive”, stated Museum Executive Director and former US Navy SEAL Michael Howard. “There are just not a lot of options out there for families on a budget which allow them to spend some quality time together”, he added.

The National Navy SEAL Museum, located on North Hutchinson Island, was founded in 1985 and continues to attract people from around the country. “The support of the local community has just been amazing. They [the community] have done so much for us, it is truly gratifying to be able to give something back”, said Museum Curator Ruth McSween. “Providing free admission allows families the opportunity to see and explore things they might otherwise pass up”, she further elaborated.

The National Navy SEAL Museum is at 3300 N. Highway A1A, and is open Monday through Saturday 10AM – 4PM, and on Sunday from 12PM – 4PM.

The National Navy UDT-SEAL Museum is the only museum dedicated solely to preserving the history of the Navy SEALs and their predecessors, including the Underwater Demolition Teams, Naval Combat Demolition Units, Office of Strategic Services Maritime Units and Amphibious Scouts and Raiders. Located in Fort Pierce, Florida - the birthplace of the Navy Frogman - the Museum promotes public education by providing the opportunity to explore the history of the Navy SEALs in an atmosphere of respect and honor.
